

City of Merrill
Regular Council Meeting
Thursday, July 16, 2026, 7:00 p.m.

The Merrill City Council held a regular meeting on July 16, 2026, in the City Council chambers at the Kissinger Center, 608 Main St., Merrill, Iowa. Mayor Norgaard called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and roll call. Council members present were Conley, Hoyt, Held, Hemmelman; Rieken was absent. Also present: Barb Gross, Pat Gray, and City Attorney Patrick Murphy.

AGENDA: Hoyt moved to approve, with Held seconding the motion. Upon roll call, all voted aye. Motion carried

CONSENT AGENDA: Conley moved to approve the consent items, with Hemmelman seconding the motion. Upon roll call, Hoyt, Hemmelman, and Conley voted aye; Held abstained; not present at meeting. Motion carried. *(a) Minutes From 06/15/2026*

PUBLIC FORUM

During the public forum, Joel Conley, 915 Northside Ct., asked for an update on Northside Ct. road repairs. Mayor Norgaard asked Public Works Superintendent Pat Gray to confirm that work was expected to begin as early as the week of July 20. Pat confirmed the timeline and noted that affected homeowners had been notified the previous day.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

The City Clerk reported that the audit is underway and requested documents are being submitted to the State Auditor for review. The EMC audit has been submitted, and the SFR and AFR will be completed after the State audit is finalized.

Fire/EMS reported 11 calls, all of which were attended. New batteries were installed in T1 and T2 and are working properly, and there is a potential buyer for the old tanker.

The Library provided its annual report and discussed future grants for digital library upgrades. Staff are also developing ideas to improve summer reading attendance in Hinton.

The MCB Committee reported completing two workdays to prepare and paint the Community Room.

Public Works reported positive revenue results for the parks department and noted that the water department has a positive balance for the first time in years.
